Introduction

Background

UNISON has designated World Environment Day (WED), 5 June 2009, as 'Green UNISON Day'. This briefing looks at our union's current work on climate change and what Scottish branches might like to do to mark the day. UNISON offices across the UK will also be taking part in a range of WED activities.

It is commemorated annually on 5 June and is one of the main ways that the UN raises worldwide awareness of the environment.

The theme for 2009 is "Your Planet Needs You – UNite to combat climate change". The UN wants to empower people to become active on "sustainable and equitable

development". Trade unions have campaigned locally and internationally on this agenda by calling for a "Just Transition" to a low-carbon economy. The March 2009 'Put People First' demonstration in London focused on Jobs, Justice and Climate issues, action demanding from world leaders at the G20 summit.

WED 2009 is also focused on the urgent need for a new international climate change deal to be agreed at the UN talks in Copenhagen in December.

UNISON's work on climate change

Climate change is one of the biggest challenges the world faces, with the December successor-to-Kyoto deal crucial to ensuring global action to protect the planet for current and future generations.

UNISON Scotland has been actively campaigning on climate change and the green workplace agenda as well as working with other organisations in the Stop Climate Chaos Scotland coalition.

UNISON has also prioritised environmental action within the organisation, launching several internal initiatives, including replacing bottled water with mainsfed water coolers, installing video conferencing facilities and arranging to recycle paper and other waste.

Action in UNISON offices on June 5 should inspire further moves to reduce our carbon footprint.

Ideas for Branch Action around World Environment Day

One key step branches can take is to start the ball rolling in letting employers know you would like to negotiate green workplace а agreement. You could write an initial letter proposing this as a fitting way to mark WED and the run-up to Copenhagen. Many employers are already looking at ways to reduce carbon emissions as part of the Carbon Reduction Commitment, coming into force next year, or as part of commitments such as the Scottish Climate Change which all Scotttish Declaration, councils have signed.
