[Roquette USA worker suffering from terminal cancer doctors say was work-related](#)

Conrad Fedler is suffering from inoperable, terminal lung cancer. He worked at the Roquette USA plant in Keokuk, Iowa. On September 28, 2010 - the company locked out hundreds of union members for insisting on their right to negotiate a collective agreement. Roquette raised his health insurance premiums by over a thousand dollars monthly - from USD 380 per month to 1,467 per month. The lockout has now entered its seventh month. The SIC Elections: The SIC's last meeting took place on 7th May 2011 at UNISON House in Glasgow. The SIC elected Sam MaCartney and Alison Cosgrove as its Chair and Vice Chair respectively, for the year 2011-12.

Scottish Venezuela Solidarity Campaign (SVSC): The SIC has agreed in its meeting on 7th May to continue its support for the campaign.

Take One Film Festival: The SIC agreed to submit a bid to the Finance Development and Organisation committee, to support its ongoing involvement in Take One Film Festival.

The SIC Work Plan: The SIC agreed in its meeting of 7 May to update its work plan.

Campaigns: The SIC agreed to continue with its campaigning agenda, to highlight issues related to campaigns such as: Labour Behind the Label, Banana Link, War on Wants, Amnesty International, Cuba Solidarity, Fair Trade, and etc.
